## Executive reports:

## President's report

1. Hydroponic Report:

A tower is being loaned to LDB, it will arrive in September of 2022. Michelle is the school lead on this project. She and I will sit down next month to formulate a plan for how to roll it out at LDB. This will include a list of required supplies and a budget.
2. School Shade:

Monique is talking to maintenance regarding trees between the tennis court and the little playground.

The grant for trees around the Reconciliation Circle has been declined. The school and PAC will sit down and review the plan and budget prior to the next meeting. We can then present to the parent community and see if we want to move forward on this project.
3. Fundraisers:

Purdy's fundraising has closed and was canceled due to a lack of orders. This was due to a lack of email reminders and classroom contact.

Blueberry Sales. Last year we sold blueberry plants. I reached out to the supplier, but they do not have blueberries to sell due to flooding and road closures. There is an opportunity for raspberries and strawberries.

## Old Business

1. Communication Coordinator Position Nominations and Election (website, email, Facebook, hotlunch site)
a. Kaelyn has agreed to take on the hotlunch coordinator position
b. Tara has agreed to take on the communications position
2. The hot lunch committee is asking PAC to increase the budget for food safe courses so that up to 3 volunteers can complete food safe training online. There is a requirement to have one person with food safe involved with serving hot lunches. Each certificate is $\boldsymbol{\$ 1 2 5}$.
a. Motion: To increase the foodsafe budget on the general account side from $\mathbf{\$ 1 0 0}$ to $\$ 400$ to cover the costs of up to 3 people to take the online foodsafe course. Upon completion of the parents will be reimbursed.
i. Kaelyn $1^{\text {st }}$ Tara $2^{\text {nd }}$ Motion has passed
3. The proposal to erect two basketball nets over the tennis court has been approved by both the city and by SD57 maintenance. This project was in the survey. The parent survey indicated only $\mathbf{1 0 \%}$ of the parents supported the installation of basketball nets and of those only $\mathbf{2 0 \%}$ wanted to spend more than $\$ \mathbf{5 0 0 0}$. The nets would be in an area presently used by younger kids.
a. Motion: To continue to consider two basketball nets over the tennis courts at a cost of up to $\$ 8000.00$.

## New Business

1. Grade 5-7 dance April 14. There is a request for PAC funding to cover the DJ and Photo Booth. The funding would cover services provided by Rhythm and Sound. The intent of the dance is not as a fundraiser, as originally intended, but rather as a space to have fun after two years of reduced interaction. There will be donations at the door, concession and photo sales which will help cover some of the cost. The total cost is $\mathbf{\$ 7 3 5}$ (including GST).
a. Motion: The PAC will cover the remaining cost of the DJ and Photo Booth Services that are not covered from donations, concession profit and photo sales. The maximum amount will be $\mathbf{\$ 7 3 5}$.

3. Leisbet Beaudry asked PAC to fund Bussing and Snacks (Oranges) for district relay and track and field events for the remainder of the school year. 80 kids in the relay. Need a one way bus, as parents will pick up kids at the end of the day. The bus is $\boldsymbol{\$ 2 0 0}$ for each event. There are two events, one is track and field, the other is relay. The event is on May 2nd and the beginning of June. Snack would be over and above, but would be oranges.
a. Motion: To budget $\$ 500$ towards bussing and healthy treats for district relay and track and field events.
