

#### **President's Report**

Our goal this year is to create some learning spaces for parents and caregivers, offer some fun activities for the kids as well as plant some trees, finish a mural and build a gaga ball court/buy volleyball nets or something along those lines.

If we've learned anything from working with the school district it's that these projects take time! I am feeling confident we will have the mural completed by the end of this school year and that we will be planting trees.

In the interest of communicating with parents, the PAC is hoping to open up the FaceBook feed for general posting. This will come with some rules and it will be on trial until the end of this school year. If the experiment goes well and isn't too labour intensive, we'll look at continuing it during the next school year.

In February, we are going to hold a Black History Month Crossword Challenge. The winner will get 1 of 2 family passes for a day to Exploration Place.

#### **Old Business**

- 1. In December every year the PAC donates some funds to the food hamper. This year we donated \$50.00
  - **Motion**: The PAC to reimburse Richard Parks for \$50.00 from general for Save-On-Foods gift certificates for the school food hamper. Shana Bowden 1sts and Deb Young Seconds. Motions approved
- 2. Swimming lessons for the grade 3's. We had started this conversation by thinking about sending all the classes swimming as part of the year end PAC event for the kids. But the younger kids can't go swimming without parents, so we moved the idea over to swimming lessons for the grade 3's. Richard 1sts and Laura 2nd's

**Motion**: The PAC to pay up to \$3000 out of general to cover swimming lessons for grade 3 students, and the students in the grade 3 split classes.

#### **New Business**

1. Monique received approval for an ILGT grant to pay for the walking story to be put on the fence by the Lhana Dune Sharing Circle. The IED will cover \$2470 of the cost and is asking the PAC to pay part of the cost up to \$1000.

The Walking story is an Indigenous Legend that is told on storyboards that will be installed on the fence. The storyboards would be in Dakelh as well as French and English. There would be a link so people can listen to the legend as well as read.

**Motion**: The PAC funds up to \$1000 to be paid out of gaming to build the "Walking Story" in coordination with the ILTG grant. Shana 1st Deb Second Motions passes

2. During the last school year one of the field trip bus fees was not passed onto the PAC. The school is requesting \$80.00 to cover this cost. As it was for the last school year, this money must now come out of the general account.

**Motion**: The PAC pays Ecole Lac Des Bois up to \$80 out of general for a field trip busing fee undertaken in the last school year. First Deb and Second Richard

3. The AV club has requested funds to purchase new cameras to support the club and their endeavor to create a yearbook for the entire school population. These cameras would be available to sign out at the library after the yearbook is completed. We are hoping that we can get some cameras donated rather than purchase new cameras.

There was a discussion of used phones

**Motion**: The PAC purchases cameras for the AV club to a maximum of \$600 out of gaming. First Nicole and Shana Motion approved

4. Ecole Lac des Bois benefits greatly from the skating rink that is established by the City and the Westbowl Community Association. As PAC we've supported our students by supplying skates and helmets as well as by managing the equipment and having the skates sharpened. What we do not do as PAC is support the efforts to maintain the rink. This falls onto the Westbowl volunteers. This also includes capital purchases such as new shovels, nets and other necessary equipment.

**Motion**: For the PAC to donate \$300 out of general to the Westbowl Community Association for supplies required to maintain or use the rink. Laura 1sts and Nicole seconds

On another note, the new rink maintenance volunteer, Mike, has offered to paint the rink with a class so they could have some fun and learn a bit about ice rinks.

5. The PAC is going to host a movie at the Cineplex Odeon. This was a hit last year and we want to offer some more fun activities for the school community. Keep your eyes open for tickets. They will be sold through the hot lunch app.
