Old Business

- 1. Within the budget we have \$2000 to plant trees. We've been speaking with maintenance and they recommend planting 5 per year. We can save money by filling in the holes after the district staff dig the holes mechanically and place the trees. The plan is to:
 - a. Request donations so that families can donate money towards trees. Then plant as many trees as we can with the budgeted and donated funds.
 - b. Plant the trees late May, and host a school community event including a bbg and tree planting
 - c. BBQ will be by donation. Host it after school on a Friday.

Motion: To fundraise for trees to plant on the school property in a community effort. The PAC will fund a barbeque for up to \$500.00 out of general. 1. Tara Klassen 2. Ariel Montgomery

- 2. We've gotten approval and a cost estimate for a gaga ball court. The estimate is \$5000, but can be reduced significantly with some design changes. The court will be an octagon. Discussion points:
 - a. Surface material ideas
 - b. Donations from parents for materials
 - c. A sign for PAC to write up prior to install with a QR code to our website with Gaga Ball instructions
 - d. A spot to store the ball so the community can use the court
